## COURSE OVERVIEW:

This dynamic workshop covers alcohol & drug clothing, alcoholic energy drinks, alco-pops, alcohol, & drug concealment methods & containers, drug paraphernalia, drug related music & groups, logos, new technology, non-traditional alcoholic beverages, social networking sites, synthetic drugs, OTC drugs, inhalants, marijuana concentrates, E-cigarettes, & popular party drugs. Learn about common stash compartments that can be used to hide weapons inside everyday clothing, containers, & other items. This session is unique, in that it provides over 100 visual aids for attendees to hold & become familiar with. In today's culture everything is person-specific & has different meanings to different individuals, & certain items have gained popularity in the alcohol & drug scene - these change every day!

Officer Galloway tailors this session to each community that he teaches in, & constantly researches current trends. Once in your community, Officer Galloway conducts a community scan spending time walking through many of your local malls, convenience stores & retail stores, identifying popular culture alcohol & other items that promote drug abuse. This allows the community to know what is going on nationally & locally in their own retail stores. For each person to help prevent youth substance abuse, you **MUST** know what is going on in your community!

## INSTRUCTOR: Officer Jermaine Galloway

has been an Idaho law enforcement officer since 1997 & has more than 12 years experience in alcohol & drug education, enforcement, & prevention. Officer Galloway has dedicated hundreds of hours to community scans, research, & substance abuse identification in communities across the country.

Officer Galloway currently provides nationwide training to coalition members, law enforcement, educators, youth, counselors, probation, health professionals, judges, & community members. Over the last three years he has trained more than 65,000 people nationwide.

Officer Galloway has created his own alcohol & substance abuse prevention & identification program called the, "You Can't Stop What You Don't Know" program & is an Idaho POST certified instructor in drug identification, alcohol beverage laws, & community policing. Officer Galloway holds a BA from the University of San Francisco, is the Vice President of Drug Free Idaho, & sits on Idaho's statewide impaired driving prevention & enforcement task force.

Officer Galloway has authored articles in American Police Beat Magazine, Campus Safety Magazine, & many local area newspapers. In 2011, he was highlighted in a national video, produced by Human Relations Media, in regards to the harms of, "Spice the Synthetic Marijuana."

In 2007, Officer Galloway created the Northwest Alcohol & Substance Abuse Conference. This now nationally recognized conference has quickly grown with attendees represented at each conference from over 28 different states & 2 countries.

In 2009, Officer Galloway received the national underage drinking law enforcement officer of the year award from the OJJDP (Office of Juvenile Justice & Delinquency Prevention) for his efforts & strategies in underage drinking education & enforcement. In 2010, Officer Galloway received the national "Mickey Sadoff" underage drinking prevention award from MADD (Mothers Against Drunk Driving)

for his efforts in education & enforcement.
